DEMAND AN ARMS EMBARGO IN SUDAN NOW!

The situation in Sudan has gone from serious to catastrophic. The ongoing conflict between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) has resulted in over 16,000 people killed and more than 11 million estimated to be internally displaced.

On April 10, Amnesty released a report revealing that RSF, during Sudan's two-year-long civil war, has subjected women and girls to widespread sexual violence aimed at humiliating, controlling, and forcibly displacing entire communities. These acts — including rape, gang rape, and sexual slavery — constitute war crimes and may also amount to crimes against humanity.

The report, "They raped all of us: Sexual violence against women and girls in Sudan," documents how RSF soldiers raped or gang-raped 36 women and girls, some as young as 15, across four Sudanese states between April 2023 and October 2024.

The civil war, which began in April 2023, has seen both RSF and SAF commit grave violations of international humanitarian law, some of which amount to war crimes.

Sudanese civilians feel forgotten in the spiral of violence devastating their country. Trapped between warring factions, they lack food, water, and access to healthcare. With limited internet access, they have no way to find safe routes or obtain critical information — not even where to find medicine. Nowhere is safe. With each passing minute, lives are being destroyed.

Demand that the UN Security Council expand the current arms embargo to cover the entire country — not just the Darfur region — and ensure its full enforcement.
