

END THE SEXUAL VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN IN SUDAN!



Dear Security Council Presidency,

With every minute that passes countless lives are ruined in Sudan. Nowhere is safe. We demand the United Nations Security Council:

- to extend the existing arms embargo to the whole country and not only to Darfur region and ensure it is fully implemented. This will disrupt the flow of weapons and contribute to reduce civilian suffering.
- to immediately call on all the warring parties and particularly the RSF to end widespread rape and other forms of sexual violence against women and girls. Call for the scaling up of humanitarian funding and response including to local women-led initiatives providing safe spaces, psychosocial support, and medical care to survivors.
- to invite survivors of sexual violence and organizations responding to the sexual violence crisis in Sudan to brief the Council.
- to request for a comprehensive and immediate briefing from the UN special Representative of the Secretary-General on Sexual Violence in Conflict following her visit to Sudan.
- to considering the current conflict, provide additional recourses to the ICC investigations, and expand the Darfur conflict referral to the ICC to also include investigations and prosecution of crimes committed under international law, in the rest of Sudan including those committed in the context of the current conflict.
- to call for the establishment of a functional MARA (monitoring, analysis, and reporting arrangements) in the line with UN Security Council resolution 1969 (2009) to ensure systematic gathering of information on conflict-related sexual violence in Sudan and to enable UNSC to hear and respond to updates on the sexual and gender-based violence crisis in the country.
