Protect the Protest

In May of last year, the engineer and climate activist Shahnewaz Chowdhury in Bangladesh published a Facebook post - in which he criticized both the coal power plant and the actions of the police. Later that month, he was arrested citing a very strict Cyber Security Act. Now he risks up to ten years in prison. Amnesty demands that Shahnewaz be released immediately and that the charges against him be dropped.

SECRETARY-GENERAL'S CORNER

Is Amnesty a rowdy organization, asked a journalist on Dagens Nyheter (Daily News). He pointed to Amnesty's decision to work for the decriminalization of prostitution, the rumors surrounding Alexei Navalny's status as a prisoner of conscience and the press release on Ukraine's military strategy that Amnesty published in August.

Is Amnesty unusually rowdy? Or is it rather a sign of one of our strengths: that we are open and transparent when we have serious problems? Perhaps our many differences of opinion are also a sign that we have a viable internal democracy?

Amnesty will continue to be controversial. We will continue to protest, act and demonstrate. But we can never settle for that. Even more important is how well we succeed in our work to ensure that human rights apply to everyone.

Therefore, it is important to also remember and highlight everything that we achieve together. When I look back to 2022, I especially think of Bernardo Caal Xól, Magai Matiop Ngong and Julia Tsvetkova who have all been released after unjust prison sentences. I am also thinking of Colombia decriminalizing abortion up to the 24th week of pregnancy. I am thinking that Spain has received a long-awaited law of consent as the tenth country in Europe. I think of the fact that more and more countries are abolishing the death penalty - and that Virginia, as the first of the southern states of the USA, has abolished the death penalty.

Keep that in mind the next time someone calls you rowdy!

It has now been shown in Gothenburg, Ängelholm, Landskrona and Växjö. Sayragul Sauytbay has appeared on three occasions and contributed much to concretize the incredible happenings in Xinjiang. Right now we are planning to show the exhibition once more in Lund at the Human Rights Festival, which will take place here on December **7-9**. Sayragul has once again promised to tell his touching story.

In short: A single small amnesty group can make a difference. We have had a lot in common project, but we have pulled it off. It became concrete Amnesty work, where we learned a lot. Our hope is that the exhibition will be able to be used by even more groups.
